Who was Mrs. F. Alberta Peterson? F. Alberta Peterson, better known as "Miss Pete", first proposed the idea of a Scholarship Fund at an ABA general membership meeting in the 1960s. The Board of Directors approved it and assigned implementation to its Women's Committee, a committee formed in the 1960s when women comprised a significant majority of ABA members. In the beginning, money was raised for the Scholarship Fund through Unit-sponsored scholarship games and a midnight game held at the Summer National. The first F. Alberta Peterson Scholarship Game was held at the 1970 Summer National in Atlanta. Today, the ABA additionally holds an annual Nationwide Scholarship Game, and Sections, Units, and clubs sponsor scholarship games as well. Using scholarship game proceeds, the ABA, through the F. Alberta Peterson Scholarship Committee and the abaECF, Inc., currently awards \$1000 scholarships by Section to qualified students after their first year attending college. The Spring 2024 F. Alberta Peterson Scholarship Game is dedicated in memory of Worth Christler who selflessly devoted himself in support of the abaECF, Inc.





## FREE PLAYS AT 2024 SPRING NATIONAL

The ABA Board recently announced a new initiative to provide recognition and incentives to players that is rolling out during this Spring National. Qualifying players will receive all or part of their entry fee back using a free play certificate redeemable this week and/or during the Summer National in Atlanta.

If a pair game is not stratified, as long as there are more than five tables in play, (1) the first place winners will be awarded a free play worth one entry fee and (2) the second place winners will be awarded a free play worth one half an entry fee. If a pair game is stratified, the first place winners in each strat with more than five tables in play will be awarded a free play worth one entry fee.

The\_Board-A-Match will award one free play to each first place team member in each strat with more than five teams, worth one entry fee. If the Knock-Out has fewer than 12 teams in a flight, a free play will be awarded to each first place team member in that flight worth one entry fee. If 12 or more teams are entered in a flight, (1) one free play will be awarded to each first place team member in that flight worth one entry fee and (2) each of the second place team members will be awarded a free play worth one half an entry fee.

No free play will be awarded for Side Games or section tops. In the event of a tie, the award is halved. The **F. Alberta Peterson Scholarship Game** and the **George Hudson Pro-Am Game** are <u>not</u> included. Certificates are not transferable or redeemable in cash. Winners may pick up their free play certificate in the National Office once the official results have been provided to the back office.

This initiative is the first of several under consideration to reward players across all fields. **It may be modified or terminated at any time without notice.** Please bear with us as we work through any kinks in the process and provide any feedback to your Section representatives on the NTC.

## **Grants available to Units and Clubs**

As one of the ways it gives back to its membership, the ABA initiated a small grant program effective January 1, 2024. Grants between \$250 and \$500 are available to Units and clubs. Grants may be used for, among other things, bridge class materials and instructor stipends, supplies to host face-to-face games, director training and fees, reducing certain sanction fees, recruitment incentives, online classes for new ABA members, and/or paying for one game for new ABA members at Nationals. Eligible Units and clubs must be in good financial standing, host weekly face-to-face games, offer classes to their members, and have candidates for teacher certification and/or director certification. One application may be submitted each calendar year. An application may be obtained (1) on the Important Documents page of the ABA website or (2) upon a request directed to (a) the ABA National Office or (b) your Sectional Vice Presidents. Completed applications will be evaluated quarterly by the Section Vice Presidents. To date, no Unit or club has applied for a grant. Please pass the word to your Units and clubs about this initiative.

## AMERICAN BRIDGE ASSOCIATION, INC. CONDITIONS OF CONTEST

**REGISTRATION** for all games except those requiring pre-registration shall begin promptly one hour prior to scheduled game time and close 15 minutes prior to game time. Entries will be sold after close of registration only if it accommodates the requirements of the game.

**DUAL REGISTRATIONS** preclude Directors from having an accurate count for setting up the game and delay the start of the game. One-quarter board penalties may be assessed for this infraction.

**ENTRY SLIPS** that are not fully completed may delay processing scores. ABA PLAYER IDENTIFICATION NUMBERS are singularly important to this process.

**ASSEMBLY** Players should be seated at their tables no later than five (5) minutes prior to game time to allow the director to verify the set up. As a courtesy to those waiting to take their seats at their tables, it is requested that all persons not registered for the event vacate the area until the game is underway.

**THE DIRECTOR in CHARGE** will give instructions for the game approximately five (5) minutes before game time. Your attention will be expected and appreciated.

**SLOW PLAY** It is not always possible to finish the round in the prescribed amount of time. However, as a courtesy to the field, it is expected that a diligent effort will be made to catch up on succeeding rounds. Pairs guilty of slow play should be reported to the Director, and penalties might be assessed for consistently slow play.

**PROPRIETARIES** Players are required to take every precaution to avoid seeing cards from boards they are yet to play. (Whenever cards are inadvertently seen from a board yet to be played, the Director should be summoned to determine whether the board can be played or if adjusted scores must be given.) Players should refrain from discussion of hands at the table or in the vicinity of other players while the game is in progress.

**SCHEDULES** All games on the National Tournament Schedule are assigned a grade level; Grade 1 (G - 1) through Grade 4 (G - 4). Masterpoints are awarded based on the grade level of the game. G-1 is the highest level, G - 4 is the lowest. The playing fee for all games is \$12.00 (other than the Scholarship game).

**CONCURRENT PARTICIPATION** No player is allowed to play in two multi–session games at the same time. 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> members of a team are permitted to play in single session games opposite the first round of the Major Knockout and Morning Knockout games. However, should their team progress to the next round, they will only receive masterpoints for the team game regardless of their finish in the single session game. 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> players are also permitted to play in single session games opposite the Board-A-Match team game. Players will not receive masterpoints from both games but only from the team game. Players entered in two games concurrently must play the entire single session game. Substitutes are not permitted. Players are not allowed to register for single session games opposite any round of the Knockout Teams other than the first. Players should notify the Director selling entries that they are playing in another game at the time of registration. Violation of these rules could result in disqualification from both games.

**PROTEST PERIOD** Scores will be displayed on the SCORE STANDS until the expiration of the PROTEST PERIOD. Information regarding the end of the PROTEST PERIOD will be printed on each score sheet that is posted. Scores of completed events will be available for inspection with the Supervisory Director.

**SCORE CORRECTION** Scores may require correction for two possible reasons: mistakes by the players making out score slips/entering into Bridgemates or errors not detected or introduced during the scoring process. In the first instance, where the players are at fault, there will be no correction of mistakes detected after the PROTEST PERIOD has expired. However, if the scoring process is the confirmed source of the error, a correction will be made whenever it is detected and reported. Scores that have been changed to incorporate corrections will be clearly marked as "REVISED or CORRECTED COPIES".

**SEEDING** ALL FIELD IV PAIR GAMES WILL BE SEEDED. Seeding will be based solely on the masterpoint holding of the top member of the pair for all persons with 10,000 or more masterpoints. The next criteria will be strength of partnerships and, finally, the strength of individual players with fewer than 10,000 masterpoints. Early registration is required to ensure proper seeding. Directors will register and assign seeded players for events where balancing the field is desirable. In the past, Directors have been seeking out top players to determine their intent to participate in upcoming events. The purpose is to include them in the seeding process. The proper procedure is that players must advise the Director or arrive early in the registration process to ensure they are properly seeded. If a player, regardless of his/her masterpoint ranking, shows up late and seeded slots have been filled, the game will not be delayed to reshuffle the field to accommodate the player. If a seeded slot is open, the player will be assigned to it, if not the player will be placed as best we can. Seeding at its best is an inexact process and a pair or two out of place should have little impact on the game.

**THE OPEN CONVENTION CHART** will be in use at all master point levels except 0 to 24. The Director will determine applicable conventions for their game to be approved by the NTA. The OPEN + CHART can only be used in National games with no upper master point restrictions and any bracket of a flight A or B Knockout which contains no team with an average master point holding of less than 1200. All special conventions must be submitted to the National Tournament Authority for advanced approval prior to use. The Open + Chart applies to all National Events with no upper master point limit in which the contestants play segments (same opponents) of 12 or more boards.

**SCORE CORRECTION:** Score correction blanks can be obtained from the Director. The PROTEST PERIOD expires as follows:

Morning Games 3:00 PM Afternoon Games 10:00 PM

Evening & Midnight Games 12:00 Noon the next day

**BIDDING BOXES** will be used in all games. You are requested to close the bidding boxes at the end of the session.

**BIDDING BOX PROCEDURE** Some players illegally place pass cards on the table rather than in the bidding box and use them from this location. This can cause problems in a number of ways. An opponent can believe that a pass has been made when such a card has been accidentally touched or moved by a player. It also is a factor when a Director is called upon to rule about intent, a mechanical slip, or a change of mind since rulings in these situations are often based on which part of the bidding box the used card is extracted. Separating pass from the double and redouble cards allows for marked indecision in these areas. Players will keep all cards in the bidding boxes and use them accordingly.

<u>ALERT PROCEDURES</u> These procedures were designed to simplify and improve the alert process by directing attention to player protection from highly unusual and unexpected conventions and treatments. However, there are some extensions which address standard methods. All natural opening bids of 1NT other than 15-17 HCP require an announcement of range. Opening bids of one club/one diamond, which might be short, require an announcement, and these bids must be alerted if they are conventional. Doubles and redoubles require alerts only when these calls carry an unusual or unexpected message. These procedures will be enforced at ABA Tournaments.

**HANDICAPPED PLAYERS** are requested to pre-register to indicate their requirement for special seating. Players with obvious mobility problems will be given preference. Stationary East/West pairs will be discouraged.

**CHECK CASHING POLICY** Entry fees may be paid by personal check made payable to the ABA for the exact amount of the entry fee. The registrar may request ABA membership identification. A handling fee of \$25.00 will be charged on all returned checks. Returned checks must be redeemed within thirty days of notification to preclude suspension.

**PARTNERSHIPS** If you need a partner for any of the events at the Nationals, we will attempt to have a PARTNERSHIP TABLE outside the playing area each day. People will be there to assist you 30 minutes prior to each major event. REMEMBER - it is more likely that we can help you find a partner if you let us know prior to the event.

**ZERO TOLERANCE** The ABA Board of Directors has adopted a zero tolerance policy for the organization and it will be strictly enforced. Discourtesy in any form, by anyone to anyone, will not be tolerated. Repeated offenses will subject an offender to suspension from participation in a particular match. The National Tournament Authority will determine further participation in an event or the tournament. The National Appeals and Ethics Committee will address the issues that require disciplinary action beyond the end of the tournament.

**PORTABLE COMMUNICATION DEVICES** Use of cell phones or other portable audible communication devices are prohibited in the playing area after beginning of play. Any violation of this rule will result in a ¼ board penalty, as applicable. Hotel personnel, selected NTA personnel in the performance of their duties, and use in medical emergencies are the only exceptions to this rule.

NO SMOKING WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE PLAYING AREA OR THE IMMEDIATE ENVIRONS AT ANY TIME.
FIREARMS ARE NOT ALLOWED IN THE PLAYING AREA OR THE IMMEDIATE ENVIRONS.
